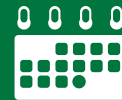

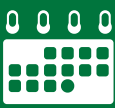

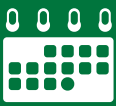

Case Studies/Risk Analysis: This session will examine wind damage to forests and trees in past storms and methods for calculating and reducing the level of risk.

23 JUNE – FIELD TOUR VISIT TO ASIAGO FOREST

On Friday 23 June, there will be a field visit to the Asiago Forest just into the foothills of the Alps. This forest is dominated by Norway spruce mainly planted just after World War I. This planting was designed to help the recovery of an area extremely badly impacted by the war and the loss of forest due to the fighting and shelling. The forest is now over mature and has been affected by several recent insect outbreaks (bark beetles and sawflies) and in 2018 suffered severe wind damage. There are many questions to be answered including how to make the forest more resilient in a future climate. The forest can act as an example for stimulating discussion about what to do in many other planted forests that are mature and at risk of high levels of damage.

24 JUNE – AFTER CONF TOUR IN DOLOMITE MOUNTAINS

Following the IUFRO conference there will be a 2-day post-conference tour (1 night) into the Dolomite Mountains. The focus of the tour will be on how to manage Alpine forests whose primary purpose is protection, including rockfall, landslides, and avalanches. This could be of interest to IEFC members involved with protection forests, e.g. in the Pyrenees, northern Spain and Scotland.
