SUPERB 'Systemic solutions for or upscaling of urgent ecosystem restoration for forest-related biodiversity and ecosystem services' Funded to support the EU Green Deal, SUPERB will restore thousands of hectares of forests and forest landscapes across Europe, starting with large-scale demonstration areas in 12 countries. Our overall goal is to demonstrate best practices backed up with the latest scientific knowledge and establish an enabling environment for large-scale restoration. Therefore, we will create a powerful multi-stakeholder network and movement for the development, uptake, and upscaling of transformative restoration approaches and actions.



Bringing together key insights through the Practitioners Pathfinder. Working closely with other SUPERB partners, Prospex Institute runs a series of events for forest restoration practitioners to share knowledge and experience, identify best practices, assess barriers and opportunities, and build a community for further collaboration. We also organise similar 'pathfinders' for policy/ governance and finance/landowners representatives. In 2024 the three communities will meet to launch a lasting coalition for change for forest restoration in Europe.
