The aim is to explore a possible collaborative financing system managed by the IEFC, identifying sources of funds and collaboration strategies that guarantee the sustainability of the sector.

The reduction of European funds threatens forestry R&D&I. Exploring collaborative models and strengthening public-private cooperation is key. Led by universities in the USA and Latin America, the FPC integrates applied research, training and technology transfer, collaborating with industry, investors and forest managers. With more than 10 million hectares under management, it is one of the largest global programmes in cooperative forestry, standing out for its impact on the adoption of sustainable and efficient practices.
