Fast-growing trees (FGTs) represent an important source of income and generate a wide range of ecosystem services that enhance resilience, improve livelihoods, absorb and store carbon, and promote human well-being, to name just a few of their many benefits. They are essential to advancing the objectives of the UN Decades of Ecosystem Restoration and Family Farming, as well as fostering progress toward greener cities. Thanks to their fast growth, high efficiency in functional ecophysiology, and ability to adapt to poor ecological conditions they are a critical element of the world's response to the global developmental challenges.

The International Commission on Poplars and Other Fast-Growing Trees Sustaining People and the Environment (IPC), a statutory body of FAO, focuses on advancing knowledge and policy on the environmental and socioeconomic dimensions of FGT cultivation. As part of its mission, the IPC has developed a new publication on innovative practices in the sustainable management of fast-growing trees, drawing on global experiences with poplars, willows, and other species.
